Glassdoor	http://www.glassdoor.com	Allows people to post how much they are earning at their current jobs. You can narrow your search down by geographic area.	Information is submitted by users and may not be reliable. Information may not be available for smaller employers.
America's Career Infonet	https://www.careeronestop.org/Toolkit/ACINetaspx	This website, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, allows users to search salary and hourly ranges by zip code and occupation category.	Information is only available as a range of salary for a broad category. Specific information about employers is not available.
Payscale	http://www.payscale.com	Provides compensation information for employers and individuals. Free comparison report showing an expected compensation range, common benefits, and job opportunities.	Must join and create a profile to access information. Information may not be employer specific.
SimplyHired	http://www.simplyhired.com/	SimplyHired's salary calculator allows users to compare salaries with others in the same profession regionally and nationally. Data is taken from their job listings.	Because salary data comes from the job listings posted on their search engine, information may not be available for smaller employers. Information is also limited to those employers who use the site to post job listings.
